1 PROCEEDINGS  
 2 MS. PRITCHARD: Good evening. My name is  
 3 Janetta Pritchard. I'm a natural resource  
 4 specialist with the Department of Natural Resources.  
 5 The purpose of this hearing is to obtain public  
 6 comments on the conditional right-of-way lease to  
 7 the Alaska Natural Gas Development Authority for a  
 8 pipeline from -- a natural gas pipeline from  
 9 Glennallen to Palmer. My co-worker and timekeeper  
 10 this evening is Debbie Whetham and our court  
 11 reporter is Britney Chonka. If you are interested  
 12 in obtaining a copy of the transcript you can  
 13 contact Britney after the hearing.  
 14 The comment period deadline for this project is  
 15 April 24th, 2006 at 5:00 p.m. That's a Monday. And  
 16 you're welcome to either send it by sail mail or  
 17 bring it into the office or to fax it in to me. My  
 18 business cards are up here with the address on it if  
 19 you'd like to pick up one before you leave.  
 20 Are there any questions before we get started?  
 21 Okay. Well, then let's start. The first person on  
 22 the list is Warren Olson. Warren, would you mind  
 23 coming up and sitting next to Britney here so that  
 24 she can hear you a little better?  
 25 MR. OLSON: Okay.

1 MS. PRITCHARD: I'm sorry, I neglected to tell  
 2 you that we're timing it. We're giving everybody  
 3 three minutes. And then if you want to come back up  
 4 after everybody's had an opportunity to comment,  
 5 you'd be welcome to. Thank you.  
 6 MR. OLSON: My name is Warren Olson. Been in  
 7 Alaska probably 46 years. I guess the expansion of  
 8 the project hooking into the gas line is necessary  
 9 for economy for Alaska and the welfare of Alaska and  
 10 so forth.  
 11 The only thing I guess I would object to is I  
 12 would strive extremely hard to keep this pipeline on  
 13 the highway. And I realize that not being in the  
 14 oil business or the pipeline business, having owned  
 15 a few wells in some areas that were bottled up and  
 16 not accessible to a pipeline structure, I understand  
 17 the stress of that.  
 18 But this area that you're departing from the  
 19 highway and coming back to the highway is one of the  
 20 major bread basket areas in Alaska. Historically  
 21 this country has probably put as much food on the  
 22 table per capita or per square mile, or however you  
 23 want to rate it, as comparable to anywhere in  
 24 Alaska. In fact, I would venture to say that 90  
 25 percent of Alaska does not produce the amount of

1 game that is in this area.  
 2 You've got the very serious area for sheep.  
 3 There's the Chugach herd, there's the Talkeetna  
 4 herd. There is a movement back and forth. And  
 5 that's just one of the resources that is extremely  
 6 important and people depend on.  
 7 So with that, if it comes down to putting spikes  
 8 in the side of the (inaudible) and hanging this  
 9 thing from hangers, I'll help you do it. But I  
 10 would really recommend that this particular route be  
 11 looked at in a very serious manner in regards to  
 12 resources that people can put on their table.  
 13 MS. PRITCHARD: Thank you, sir.  
 14 MR. OLSEN: You bet.  
 15 MS. PRITCHARD: Arthur Almon.  
 16 MR. ALMON: My name is Arthur Almon, and I've  
 17 been in Alaska about 35 years. And I've worked on  
 18 the original oil pipeline. The only fault that I  
 19 can see with this is that it's not tied into a  
 20 direct line from Prudhoe Bay to Valdez. And if we  
 21 wait until this line goes through Canada, we're  
 22 going to be waiting 15, 20 years. And by that time  
 23 Anchorage is going to be out of natural gas. You'll  
 24 have people from Kenai to the Mat-Su Valley in  
 25 Anchorage scrambling to convert their furnaces to

1 some other type of heating fuel. And we're going to  
 2 lose an opportunity to use that gas for developing  
 3 other natural resources.  
 4 And I support -- I support the line in and of  
 5 itself, I support that, but what I don't support is  
 6 the fact that by the time this is -- this gas is  
 7 available to us under the current plan, people are  
 8 going to be leaving Alaska in droves because they --  
 9 if you can't afford to heat your house, you can't  
 10 afford to live here.  
 11 And you have enough senior citizens now  
 12 complaining about the fact that they can't afford to  
 13 heat their houses, that people in the Interior,  
 14 they're stealing fuel oil from each other just to  
 15 keep their houses warm.  
 16 And this is -- I mean, to me the whole idea of  
 17 running a gas line through Canada is against the  
 18 best interests of the state of Alaska. And I think  
 19 that's about all I have to say. I have a lot more  
 20 to say, but it's more on the gas line going to  
 21 Valdez than this spur line. Thank you.  
 22 MS. PRITCHARD: Thank you very much.  
 23 Warren?  
 24 MR. KEOGH: My name is Warren Keogh and I'm a  
 25 resident of Chickaloon, Alaska community through

1 which about 20 miles of the pipeline is planning to  
 2 pass through. And I'm speaking for myself only. I  
 3 am the director and member of the Chickaloon  
 4 community council, but I have brief comments which  
 5 are pretty much unprepared are -- do not reflect  
 6 any -- the community council's or anyone else's.  
 7 And I would urge the DNR commissioner to deny  
 8 ANGDA's application to the pipeline right-of-way and  
 9 for many reasons, but I'll just list a couple.  
 10 Generally the Alaska Natural Gas Development  
 11 Authority has -- we've apprised them in the last 12  
 12 months, some folks in our community as individuals  
 13 and certainly through the community council and I  
 14 guess my feelings generally reflect the resolution  
 15 that our community has submitted to the ANGDA board  
 16 of directors and we've shared with the Department of  
 17 Natural Resources for the many concerns that we  
 18 have.  
 19 One of those, too, that I'd like to point out is  
 20 our community will have many of the -- of the -- few  
 21 of the benefits of the -- that may be associated  
 22 with the issuing of the right-of-way and the  
 23 eventual construction of the pipeline. But we'll  
 24 have quite a few detriments. We'll have many of the  
 25 negative impacts of the construction and the

1 pipeline.  
 2 And I think an important thing, too, one of the  
 3 reasons I'm not in favor of this is right now it's a  
 4 toss-up whether or not the Southcentral Alaska,  
 5 Anchorage especially and the Kenai will be supplied  
 6 by gas through a pipeline either along the Parks  
 7 Highway or the Glenn Highway. So it seems to me, in  
 8 addition to the million or so dollars that have  
 9 already been spent on studies for the spur line from  
 10 Glennallen to Palmer, before this right-of-way is  
 11 issued, that it's premature. We've gotten the cart  
 12 in front of the horse here.  
 13 If you're going to issue a right-of-way, decide  
 14 where the route is going to be before the -- before  
 15 the right-of-way is issued and before any further  
 16 State funds are expended to carry the project  
 17 forward.  
 18 And I also just, I have personal reasons too, I  
 19 know that the -- due to the concerns of several  
 20 individuals, myself included, in the community  
 21 council that in the 20 miles that the pipeline  
 22 passes through our community the route has been  
 23 changed.  
 24 I think we've gotten the attention of ANGDA over  
 25 the last 12 months or so, almost, but even with the

1 route changes -- and it was initially routed through  
 2 my private property. But nonetheless, I've lived in  
 3 this area for over 20 years and even -- even -- and  
 4 I acknowledge ANGDA's attempt to accommodate as many  
 5 people as possible and be sensitive as much as they  
 6 can be with the routing and the alignment of the  
 7 pipeline, but still, nonetheless, this goes right  
 8 through the place where I've hunted moose for a lot  
 9 of years. It goes right through the place where now  
 10 where I've berrypicked in the past.  
 11 And my time's up. But I have very -- a lot of  
 12 personal reasons for opposing this as well, I guess,  
 13 perhaps, even selfish reasons. And finally I will  
 14 say that I will be preparing some extensive written  
 15 comments that I'll submit prior to the deadline for  
 16 public comment period.  
 17 Thanks for the opportunity to speak. And I'll  
 18 be glad to, if anybody -- I don't think anybody else  
 19 is here from Chickaloon, but if anybody wants a  
 20 perspective afterwards here that's in the audience  
 21 from one local, I'll be glad to hang out, share my  
 22 thoughts or information or experience from local  
 23 citizens on the matter. Thanks.  
 24 MS. PRITCHARD: Thank you very much.  
 25 Is there anyone else that would like to speak?

1 We have some individuals that put question marks  
 2 down. Is there anybody else that would like to come  
 3 up again?  
 4 MS. BACKES: I'd like to speak. I said no --  
 5 MS. PRITCHARD: Are you Lori?  
 6 MS. BACKES: Yes.  
 7 My name is Lori Backes. I live in Fairbanks,  
 8 Alaska. Do you need my address?  
 9 MS. PRITCHARD: We've got it right here.  
 10 MS. BACKES: Okay. I'm executive director of  
 11 the All-Alaska Alliance. We are an organization  
 12 that supports an all-Alaska gas line. Specifically  
 13 to these permits, I'm not familiar with them enough  
 14 to comment, but I did want to say that I -- that I  
 15 strongly support the efforts of ANGDA in getting  
 16 this route permitted and moving along and prepared  
 17 so that it can, as quickly as possible, branch off  
 18 of a gas line from the North Slope of Alaska to  
 19 bring gas into the Southcentral area.  
 20 The potential for gas shortages in Southcentral  
 21 is not a secret, and expected to happen as early as  
 22 2009. So as quickly as possible we, as Alaskans,  
 23 need to prepare to address that shortage.  
 24 It's appalling to me to hear producer companies  
 25 that have gas holdings elsewhere in the world

1 announce that they are studying the prospect of  
 2 bringing natural gas into Cook Inlet from Australia.  
 3 As Alaskans I think that that would be the highest  
 4 travesty if a -- certainly my lifetime if we allowed  
 5 natural gas to sit undeveloped on the North Slope  
 6 and had imports coming in from another country.  
 7 I support the efforts of ANGDA in, as I've  
 8 already mentioned, preparing to branch off of a gas  
 9 line to bring gas into Southcentral Alaska.  
 10 However, I do believe that the pipeline from the  
 11 North Slope into Canada is unlikely to happen,  
 12 certainly will not happen in time to solve  
 13 Anchorage's shortages, coming shortages. However I  
 14 believe it's unlikely to happen in our lifetime.  
 15 I heard on the news just this afternoon that the  
 16 governor has met with a couple of premieres from  
 17 Canada and the announcement was made today that the  
 18 producers will not build an Alaska gas pipeline  
 19 prior to the construction of the Mackenzie Valley  
 20 Pipeline.  
 21 Canada has its own gas reserves that they insist  
 22 be taken into the Alberta market prior to any gas  
 23 line from Alaska. This is not something new. We've  
 24 heard this from Canadian news sources for a couple  
 25 of years and in a couple of different venues. I

1 believe this may be the first time it was announced  
 2 on this side of the border.  
 3 So to the greatest extent possible, I support  
 4 ANGDA's efforts to bring a spur line off of a  
 5 natural gas pipeline that would go from the North  
 6 Slope of Alaska to Valdez. That project is already  
 7 permitted. The only hurdle it needs to overcome  
 8 before they can actually start moving forward on it  
 9 is the acquisition of gas supplies and I would  
 10 encourage ANGDA to do whatever they can to assist an  
 11 entity in securing the gas supplies needed for a  
 12 project from the North Slope to Valdez so that this  
 13 project into Southcentral can move forward.  
 14 Thank you.  
 15 MS. PRITCHARD: Thank you very much.  
 16 Is there anyone else?  
 17 Then we'll close this hearing. Thank you all  
 18 for attending.  
 19 (Whereupon, the proceedings were concluded.)
