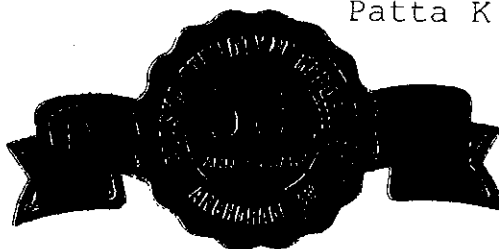

PROCEEDINGS

MS. PRITCHARD: Good evening. My name is Janetta Pritchard and I work for the Department of Natural Resources. The purpose of this public hearing is to get your testimony and your comments regarding the Alaska Natural Gas Development Authority's proposal for a gas line from Glennallen to Palmer.

The way this hearing is run, is that everybody will be given three minutes to talk and if at the end of the hearing there is some discussion, we will see whether or not there is more time or more if people come in and see what our time is like and you would be welcome to come back up and speak.

My assistant is Debbie Whethem. She is with the Department of Natural Resources. The court reporter is Patta Johnson. If you want a copy of the this record, you would need to talk to Patta about that. Written comments can be submitted until 5:00 p.m. April 24. You are welcome to send snail mail or you can fax me. I've left some business cards up there. There is also a fax number though we are not accepting e-mails.

A. April 24 at 5:00 p.m. My business card also has the address for where you can mail your comments. I believe that is everything on my list; do you have any questions before we start?

MR. HEINZE: You might want to explain the term conditional right-of-way?

MS. PRITCHARD: A conditional right-of-way is what ANGDA has applied for. And it is not a property interest. What it is, is it gives ANGDA or whomever gets a conditional lease, a document that they can go to a financial institution and talk to them about getting financing for their project.

There is a number of things that ANGDA will have to do after they get this conditional lease. They will need to get their financing in order; they will need to show the department that they're able to construct this pipeline.

There is 25 different plans that they will have to submit to the department for approval. Those plans involve air quality, environmental things, stream crossings, restoration, archeology. I can't remember all of them. But we do have all that information on our website and you're welcome to go out there and look. Our website is www.jpo.doi.gov of the information is on there.

The conditional lease is not -- I think the important thing to know is that the conditional lease is not a property interest and ANGDA will need to perfect this lease prior to getting that property interest. So it could be a few years down the line before they actually get everything together and it depends on how everything falls into place for them. Are there any other questions? Well, let's start. Mary do you want to start?

MS. ODDEN: This is a written comment, but I will read it as well. My husband Jim and I own and operate the Copper River Record, the community newspaper that serves the Copper Valley Communities. We are also land owners at Mile 148 on the north side of the Glenn Highway, the location through which the proposed gas line hopefully will pass.

As business owners, land owners and residents of the State of Alaska, we would like to express our support for the proposed spurline route and say that we believe it's in the best interest of this area, and the State as a whole, that this right-of-way be approved and this gas line be built.

The deepening and diversity of local economies will be served by bringing gas and attendant products to the greatest number of Alaskan

communities. The Glennallen to Palmer route not only brings gas to the Matsu Valley and Anchorage and points south, it opens up the possibilities of local Copper Valley electrical generation from gas and the extraction of propane for local use.

At present our economies are shallow and fragile because utility costs prohibits many kinds of appropriate economic endeavors that our citizens could undertake. Bringing natural gas through this area will greatly increase our economic strength. Bringing gas through Glennallen will also open the possibility of North Slope gas being brought to Valdez for coast line use and possible export. All the these represent a long term value to the State and its citizens.

In addition to our support for the gas line itself, we would like to commend the Alaska Natural Gas Development Authority for the careful and thorough way they have conducted public meetings, taking comments and concerns and have presented the results of their investigations along the pipeline route. By their expertise and the concern they have given to information gathering, they have inspired public trust. And that's Sincerely, Mary and Jim Odden.

1 MS. PRITCHARD: Thank you, Mary. Robert
 2 Wilkinson.
 3 MR. WILKINSON: My name is Robert
 4 Wilkinson, W- i- l- k- i- n- s- o- n. I'm a 47-year
 5 resident of the state of Alaska and I'm here in the
 6 capacity as the chief executive officer of Copper
 7 Valley Electric Association.
 8 We are a non-profit, member owned electric
 9 cooperative utility that serves Valdez and the Copper
 10 River Basin, an area of the state that is about 100
 11 miles wide by 150 miles deep. This is a vitally
 12 important project not only for my members but for the
 13 State of Alaska.
 14 It's really important that we move this
 15 project forward which hopefully will bring gas down
 16 the Richardson corridor which has tremendous economic
 17 development benefits not only for this region but the
 18 State as a whole. Two miles up the road here at the
 19 junction of the Glenn and the Richardson Highways is
 20 the only place in the state that you can stand and
 21 connect with five major highways in one spot. You
 22 can go to Valdez on the Richardson Highway, the
 23 second is connecting with the marine highway system,
 24 go north to Fairbanks up the Tok road and on into
 25 Anchorage. It's the cross roads of the

1 transportation system on the eastern side of the
 2 state.
 3 This is a very important infrastructure
 4 project, as Mary indicated, from the standpoint of
 5 lowering the cost of electricity. \$65 for a barrel of
 6 oil may be good for the State Treasury, but my
 7 customers are paying \$17 to \$18 per unit BPU's for
 8 fuel and their electric bill today. It's just a
 9 killer in what it does to discretionary income and
 10 continuing to suppress economic development in the
 11 region.
 12 This utility has a number of generating
 13 sources. We have a hydro project down in Valdez that
 14 produces 58 percent of our energy; the other 42
 15 percent comes from thermal plants. We are certainly
 16 hopeful that project such as tapping the North Slope
 17 gas would deliver extremely economic benefits to the
 18 region. So we support the work of the Authority and
 19 what they have done and I will be providing written
 20 comments and I appreciate the opportunity to speak
 21 today.
 22 MS. PRITCHARD: Thank you. Michael
 23 Lanegan?
 24 MR. LANEGAN: I'm Michael Lanegan and I
 25 really don't have an awful lot to gain one way or the

1 other from the coming gas line. I'm too old to work
 2 and I am retired and I kind of like that.
 3 I've lived here in the Glennallen
 4 community for 30 years and I've kind of grown to like
 5 it and I like the people here. I would like to see
 6 them have an opportunity to make some decent wages
 7 for a length of time and relieve the dregs we have
 8 experienced for quite some time.
 9 I have had the good fortune to work on the
 10 Trans Alaska Pipeline when it came through and it
 11 accounts for many many hours of work that I put in.
 12 It was a real shot in the arm of my beginning a
 13 career here and life in Glennallen.
 14 I do have one small vested interest in the
 15 matter and that is propane. If we do put in a
 16 compressor plant possibly an inexpensive propane
 17 outlet would be good. Not only for me because I heat
 18 with propane at this point in time, but everyone else
 19 who, or anyone else who didn't want to pay \$2.50 a
 20 gallon for heating oil could probably come into
 21 propane for half that amount, convert their own
 22 heating units to the use of propane or purchase new
 23 ones and come out ahead. As they come to us now all
 24 of our propane or consumptive propane in this area is
 25 brought in, I think, from Anchorage at the Port of

1 Entry from the Cook Inlet. But I don't know that,
 2 I'm guessing.
 3 We are paying, at this time for heating
 4 alone, \$2.42 a gallon for propane. If that could be
 5 reduced to half or even somewhere close to that, it
 6 would be a major savings to the community. Also the
 7 opportunity for Mr. Wilkinson to put Copper Valley
 8 Electric on natural gas thus saving power for
 9 electricity could be a boon for us also. It could be
 10 very very good.
 11 There are people here in the valley who
 12 oppose this sort of thing and whatnot, but I can't
 13 understand that nature. It appears this is a win/win
 14 situation for the community and the people of the
 15 community, so I support it thoroughly. Thank you
 16 very much.
 17 MS. PRITCHARD: Thank you, sir. Alex
 18 LeMaster.
 19 MR. LEMASTER: Thank you for coming out
 20 and giving us a chance to bend your ear about our
 21 beautiful part of the world. I'm Alan LeMaster and I
 22 have been a resident of this community for about 22
 23 years and I own a company in Gakona, Gakona Junction
 24 Village for that whole time. And unfortunately, like
 25 Mr. Wilkinson's company, I am also a nonprofit

1 organization. It wasn't meant to be that way, but
 2 the reason is is that it's so hard to make a profit
 3 in this part of the world because of our energy
 4 costs. They are devastating to us.
 5 To put it into perspective we are probably
 6 paying three and four times the electric bill than if
 7 our same electric was in Anchorage. And that amount
 8 of money going out into fuel and electricity and
 9 propane is significant. And having been in the
 10 visitor industry in this area for those 20 years, I'm
 11 very much in tune with the fact there are companies
 12 that would like to come out here and participate in
 13 our visitor industry because we have so much to offer
 14 but they simply don't do it because they know how
 15 difficult a struggle it is for those of us who have
 16 made the commitment.
 17 I believe that by bringing the gas
 18 pipeline through we have a short term benefit of a
 19 lot of people in the area very much willing and able
 20 and ready to go work and help put it together and you
 21 would have a work force out here that would
 22 participate.
 23 In the long run as was mentioned earlier,
 24 you will find a business community that will be very
 25 vibrant. East Alaska is the growth area for the

1 visitors in our state. As anyone who as been to
 2 Denali knows, millions and millions of big-time
 3 dollars have been pumped into marketing Denali as a
 4 tourist destination for many many years, long before
 5 I ever came here. In fact, it all started in the
 6 '50s with Chuck West and Brad Phillips who used to
 7 take little buses on dirt roads up in that area.
 8 Well, they've pretty much outgrown
 9 themselves and it won't be long before that whole
 10 area up there is super saturated it if isn't already.
 11 It's harder and harder to get into the park and to
 12 see the park for the visitors. And when you get
 13 there, you are just crammed on buses.
 14 Our industry is looking for an outlet, an
 15 escape valve if you will. Everybody in our industry
 16 that I've talked to during the last three or four
 17 years, including DNR, and BLM and Parks Service as
 18 well as the leaders in the Alaska Travel Association,
 19 has Copper Valley as the next area for us to develop.
 20 This will go a long way towards making that dream
 21 come true. Thank you.
 22 MS. PRITCHARD: Doug Vollman.
 23 MR. VOLLMAN: My name is Doug Vollman and
 24 I work as an advocate for the agricultural sector
 25 here in Copper Valley. I feel that it's imperative

1 and I want to reiterate what everyone has said: Low
 2 cost energy is important for growth in all sectors
 3 and especially in the Ag sector. Along with that
 4 value-added products throughout Alaska we can only
 5 accomplish that with cheaper energy and I do applaud
 6 the Gas Development Authority for their efforts and
 7 their openness in sharing and addressing concerns by
 8 people along the route because that's important not
 9 just to just steam roll any project.
 10 I think this is a good project and the
 11 sooner we start the ball rolling the better because
 12 it is not an over-night deal. Every month we delay
 13 in any project costs us in the long run. But this is
 14 a very important project for all of Alaska and I
 15 wholeheartedly support the efforts. Thank you.
