PROCEEDINGS

MS. PRITCHARD: Good evening. My name is Janetta Pritchard, and I am with the Department of Natural Resources. We are here to obtain public comment on the Alaska Natural Gas Development Authorities application for a conditional right-of-way lease from the Department.

The conditional right-of-way lease is only on State land. And although it may impact private lands, we're only looking at the State lands. This is Debbie Whetham. She is our -- my timekeeper. We have a three-minute limit. If you -- after you comment and there's time afterwards, you're welcome to come back and give additional comments.

I ask that for our court reporter's benefit, that you come up to the podium so that she can record your comments. Our court reporter this evening is Britney Chonka. And if you're interested in a copy of the report, you can contact Britney after the meeting's over.

Written comments may be submitted to my office. My cards are at the back of the room. With the address and a fax number. The comment period deadline is 5:00 p.m. April 24th and they have to be

a glass of water would help me.

But I've put a lot of thought into what I say. And I care. But there's a lot of people out here that's needing jobs. And I know that you can add value to all of the carbons in this state, whether it's coal, gas, oil. And from that you can -- if you had an institution of technology and the people that are trained to run an institution that knows what they're doing, that we can greatly keep, maybe keep some of our children here and develop materials that can be used for -- for example, like affordable housing, are materials that we can ship out of the country.

But I know that you have the chemistry of the body, the manufacturing of chemicals that can be made out of it for the human body and for materials sciences. And I think that's what we should be doing.

We don't -- today we lack the institution to have it available so that we can keep our children here in Alaska. We certainly need more jobs here. I see people out on the streets. I know people sleeping in cars today. We need jobs now. So we need to keep our industry at Nikiski going.

We've got some pipelines down there now and we

received in order to be considered for the -- in the final decision.

Are there any questions?

Let's start.

Clarence Furbush.

State your name.

MR. FURBUSH: Clarence E. Furbush. And my interest is getting the amount of gas, particularly interested in getting it to our port facility where we hope to have industry developed in the future. But I'd like to get the gas pipeline to come a route that would benefit most of the people, as many people as possible, for their benefit. And open it where the supply would be big enough so that we could actually ship gas out of the port of -- of Port McKenzie And I think the port facility has the capability of handling world class ships. And I think we have people in the area that are looking into the future to keep that port active. And I'm hoping that somewhere along the line that we can stop acting like a third-world country and do -- get a institution of technology that will add value to the carbon chemistry.

I have to watch myself, because I -- I'm not used to public speaking and if I get a little woozy,

want to keep them full to keep them working. And you got the population in Anchorage, Kenai and the Mat-Su Borough that is particularly a large proportion of the population of the state of Alaska and they should have the advantage to keep a lot of that material here and utilize it here in our area for development purposes, development and jobs.

I think we have people here with the imagination that it would take to carry us a hundred years into the future. I just hope that somehow that it can -- if anything, it can be done the quickest and the volume of gas that we need at a reasonable price.

As I understand it, the price of gas here, I know for a fact, that I -- my gas bill has gone up considerably. It's been great savings to my family. The prices will go up, and I understand that it takes -- the bigger the supplier you have and the more consumers you have, the cheaper that they can sell that gas.

Right now -- we need it now because it looks like they haven't found anything new out in Cook Inlet. So the quicker we get the natural gas to the port facility, the quicker we can get people to thinking into the future of how we can utilize that. I, myself, feel that it's a matter of time

1 before we'll be able to use the Northwest Passage
 2 and put ships through that Northwest Passage into
 3 the Atlantic Ocean. And from that it's like FedEx,
 4 FedEx ships all over the world. They trade their
 5 cargo here in Anchorage. And they can do the same
 6 thing here at the top of the world, is ship supplies
 7 all over the world with material from -- that's made
 8 from the carbon chemists. Whether it's medicine or
 9 material to build affordable housing.

10 I guess that's all I need to say. I guess I
 11 told you something that may help you on what some
 12 people think. But I think there's a lot of people
 13 out there that have thoughts but they don't have the
 14 guts or the time. They're all -- I don't know what
 15 they're doing, but they sure don't seem to be here
 16 tonight. And that really bothers me to think that
 17 this is what is happening to our society.

18 I go into a subdivision, I don't see a kid out
 19 on the street anymore. They're watching the TV. I
 20 mean, what the hell's going on? Is that our
 21 teachers? What's the matter with our teachers, you
 22 know? Why aren't they -- I look out here, I said
 23 gee, look -- I said -- I could tell you what I saw.
 24 I can tell what you I saw just looking. So that --
 25 and if they don't integrate it to the teachers,

1 they're starting to -- what I'm saying is we're
 2 spending a lot of money on our kids. And if we can
 3 do something to keep them here in this institution
 4 that is -- that will give them the vast degrees they
 5 need to -- to develop the materials that we need to
 6 develop the economy and world businesses.

7 MS. PRITCHARD: Thank you very much, Mr.
 8 Furbush.

9 MS. PRITCHARD: Jerry Keffer?

10 MR. KEFFER: My name is Jerry Keffer. I live in
 11 Eagle River and this gas pipeline has been a long
 12 time and coming. I'm glad to see it's finally
 13 coming to fruition. The only question obviously is
 14 where is it going to come through. The only time,
 15 sir, that you're going to see anybody coming to
 16 another meeting is when they start building it.
 17 Then they'll start having opposition because they're
 18 going to say: Well, I don't want it coming through
 19 my area. And they've had plenty of time and
 20 opportunity to bring their question forward.

21 I agree with you that we do need this gas
 22 pipeline. I want to see that we keep our resources
 23 within this state. I do not want to see our
 24 resources going out like they have been going with
 25 the oil and other stuff. I know we reap benefits

1 from the oil but we don't control it.

2 I think this state needs to start controlling
 3 its resources, because if it doesn't do it, we're
 4 just at the will of the people in the Lower 48. I
 5 have nothing against them, that's where I came from,
 6 but this state has a bad habit of letting other
 7 people control their resources and what we do with
 8 them. Personally I'm just getting tired of it.

9 Thank you for your time.

10 MS. PRITCHARD: Thank you very much.
 11 Maria?

12 MS. KEFFER: I'm Maria Keffer and I live in
 13 Eagle River. And I would ask that the ADNR approve
 14 this conditional right-of-way. Natural gas is going
 15 to be the fuel of the future until we get exotic
 16 things going. The clean-burning gas. The pipeline
 17 will have little environmental impact once it is
 18 built. It's underground. People probably won't
 19 even know it's there. And yet they're going to reap
 20 great rewards. In fact they will supply cheap fuel
 21 that's clean burning.

22 We must develop Alaska resources for Alaskans,
 23 and I applaud ANGDA for their effort in getting this
 24 spur down to Southcentral. Thank you.

25 MS. PRITCHARD: Thank you, ma'am.

1 Would anybody else like an opportunity to speak?

2 MS. FREDRICKSON: My name is Theresa
 3 Fredrickson. I wasn't planning on speaking.

4 MS. PRITCHARD: Could you please come up here,
 5 it's for the benefit of the court reporter.

6 Theresa Fredrickson. I'm from the Mat-Su
 7 Borough Planning Department. And I had originally
 8 reviewed the draft document. And the Borough fully
 9 supports any economic diversity in lower natural gas
 10 costs to Borough residents. Of course the health
 11 welfare and safety of Borough residents is our main
 12 priority so we would like to be apprised or alert of
 13 any wastewater disposal. And, of course, any
 14 cultural resources along the right-of-way
 15 acquisition. In short of that we fully support the
 16 acquisition.

17 MS. PRITCHARD: Thank you very much.
 18 Yes, sir?

19 This is Mr. Furbush again. Can I say a couple
 20 more comments again? Again, Clarence E. Furbush.
 21 My -- one of my concerns is seems to me that the oil
 22 companies are telling Alaska what it can do with its
 23 gas and oil. And it really behooves me to how to
 24 get away from it. And how -- when they are going
 25 into secret sessions to make settlements with the --

1 with our governor doing that, it seems ridiculous to
 2 me.
 3 But there seems to be no way that you can get it
 4 out of the hands of the -- why don't we buy that
 5 damn pipeline? Build it. We've got 32 billion
 6 dollars in the bank. If it's such a good deal for
 7 them, why wouldn't it be a good deal for us?
 8 I really wonder how you can get that pipeline
 9 and get it to the market. They've tied up this gas
 10 for years and sitting on it. They've got frozen gas
 11 in there that they don't even know how to get out
 12 from the ground. A lot of people don't even know
 13 about it.
 14 Long-term trend is, if we could hire our own
 15 people, we could hire Anadarko and some of these
 16 other people to do our research and development.
 17 They can go out there, it doesn't have to be BP
 18 and -- some of the others, Shell, Shell Oil.
 19 MS. PRITCHARD: Mr. Furbush, what we're really
 20 looking for are comments on this project from
 21 Glennallen to Palmer. And I understand that the --
 22 MR. FURBUSH: Okay. I'm sorry.
 23 MS. PRITCHARD: That's okay. But I just want
 24 you to understand what we're looking for in this
 25 hearing.

1 MR. FURBUSH: Yeah. Well, I say on that, that
 2 part of it, you know, the quickest, the cheapest way
 3 to get it here, you know, but get it here as soon as
 4 possible as possible so we can start doing something
 5 with our economy.
 6 We're hurting for jobs. I mean you've got the
 7 people that -- you come back from -- I had a friend
 8 from Iowa out visiting me. Took him down to the
 9 airport, come back against the traffic going to
 10 Anchorage. You know, all those jobs down there. I
 11 don't know how many of them were gas, you know, how
 12 many jobs are created from the gas industry or the
 13 oil industry, we sure as heck made something to make
 14 the materials to get people jobs. It just seems
 15 crazy that if the oil companies can get it and make
 16 a profit, why can't we?
 17 I seen one outfit made \$16 billion in profits.
 18 I tell you one thing, that they got patent dollars,
 19 I don't know why they don't seek out U.S. patent
 20 dollars. I know NASA and General Dynamics can build
 21 anything they want to. And by God why they aren't
 22 building an automobile that gives us, say, 89 miles
 23 to the gallon is beyond me, because they can do it.
 24 They got the people that they can hire. All it
 25 takes is the skilled people. We've got it this in

1 this country. I looked it up, U.S. Patent Office.
 2 You'll see why they have secret patents, and they
 3 had a patent on the stuff they used in North Africa
 4 against the Germans. And that was -- that was a
 5 secret fuel. And they were --
 6 MS. PRITCHARD: Yeah. Yeah.
 7 MR. FURBUSH: For the benefit of you people, I
 8 say the sooner the better.
 9 MS. PRITCHARD: Great. Thank you very much.
 10 So -- well, it looks like there's no one else,
 11 unless someone would like to come up. So we'll

 13 attending.
